

## Planets in May

M - Morning sky, before sunrise, E - evening sky, after sunset

Mercury - difficult to see later not visible (M)

Venus - great visibility (M)

Mars - average visibility (E) @0.9-1.1 mag

Jupiter - fairly good visibility (E) @-2.0 mag later average

Saturn - average visibility (M)

Uranus - extremely difficult to see

Neptune - extremely difficult to see

#### Selected events:

- 4 May Mars in Beehive cluster (M44) with Moon nearby (1° away)
- 5 May Moon close to Regulus
- 17 May 23 h Uranus conjunction
- 30 May 04 h Mercury superior conjunction
- 1 June 03 h Venus greatest western elongation

## Eta Aquarids meteor shower

Period: 19 Apr-28 May

Peak: 5–6 May

Zenithal hourly rate: Up to 50

Velocity: 66 km/s

Parent: 1P/Halley

The meteors we currently see as members of the Eta Aquariid shower separated from Halley's Comet hundreds of years ago. The current orbit of Halley's Comet does not pass close enough to the Earth to be a source of meteoric activity.



## At the observing evening we will be observing:

- Still visible Mars and Jupiter
- Hercules, Corona Borealis, Bootes, Virgo, Leo constellations
- Too many to mention M and NGC objects in Virgo and Coma Berenices






# Did you know?



**Star Wars Day** is an informal commemorative day observed annually on May 4 to celebrate the Star Wars media franchise.





The first recorded reference of the phrase being used was on May 4, 1979, the day after Margaret Thatcher was elected as Prime Minister of the United Kingdom. The Conservatives placed a congratulatory advertisement in the Evening News saying "May the Fourth Be with You, Maggie. Congratulations."
